"If it appears that the immediate safety or well-being of a child is endangered, that the family may flee or the child will be unavailable for purposes of conducting a child protective investigation, or that the facts otherwise so warrant, the department shall commence an investigation Priority immediately, regardless of the time of day or night." (s. 39.201(5), F.S.) Response Priority reflects adjustments made by CPI Supervisors, as provided in Rule 65C-29.003, F.A.C.
- 24-Hour Response Time: "In all other child abuse, abandonment, or neglect cases, a child protective investigation shall be commenced within 24 hours after receipt of the report." (s. 39.201(5), F.S.)
